## #19, Premium Trapper Versions as Queen Cutlery Special Projects 3-28-2020

This pattern has been popular for a long time, based on its application in skinning and cutting apart animals by trappers. Over the years it has also become very popular with collectors for the long and graceful handle (4") which allows a showcase for the various handle materials. This is an incomplete reference – but a start. Many of the "Franks Classic knives" are listed as 1 of 1 – very much rare collector's knives at the end of Daniel Family ownership.
